Directions: Take Rt. 95 South (Beltway) to Exit 1; south on Richmond Highway (Rt. 1) for 3.5 miles; right onto Lockheed Blvd.; after 1/2 mile, turn right onto Harrison Lane; Huntley is 1/4 mile up the hill. ❖

Wetlands Awareness Day

Sunday, May 4, 2008 • noon to 3 p.m. The biggest event on the Huntley Meadows Park calendar is Wetlands Awareness Day. Hundreds come to understand the importance of wetlands and to experience their beauty. Interpreters stationed along the boardwalk unlock the mysteries of wetland soils, arrange close-up looks at wildlife through telescopes, and impart a sense of what an amazing place Huntley Meadows is! There is also a fun fair for children, with games, prizes and an old-fashioned cake walk. ❖

Huntley Construction Close to Starting!

We recently received a message from Michael Rierson, Stewardship Branch Manager, Resource Management Division, Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA), with some good news. The FCPA has nearly finished obtaining the necessary permits for construction at Historic Huntley. The new project team that will handle the final planning stages and oversee construction has met to begin the process.

Probable costs are being developed and compared with the available funds. Mr. Rierson did not state the amount of funds available at this time, but it will include the remaining funds from the 1998 bond issue, proffer funds, and federal and state grant funds. Once FCPA staff has accurate and realistic information on the various aspects of the construction costs, staff will meet with the Historic Huntley Project Team to review available funding and set priorities.

Mr. Rierson hopes the Project Team will meet in mid-May, so we might have more definite information for members at the Open House. We also were glad to hear that even though Mr. Rierson will retire from the FCPA this summer, he will stay on as an historic preservation technical advisor for Huntley. His long interest in the history of Huntley and hard work during the investigation stage of the project are very valuable assets to us and will be a great benefit to the careful and accurate restoraton of Historic Huntley. ❖

Margaret Harrison Gibbs' Book Collection

Susan Hellman, a Fairfax County historian and Gibbs relative, has inherited a collection of books that belonged to Margaret Harrison Gibbs. Gibbs was the daughter of Albert W. Harrison, who owned Huntley 1868 to 1911, and sister of Albert R. Harrison, Huntley's owner from 1911 to 1946. Susan has shared an annotated inventory with park staff. Some of the books date to when Margaret lived at Huntley, including a volume of Tennyson with a flower pressed into it. *The Marriage Gift* by James Petrie has the following frontispiece inscription:

This Certifies that J. Norman Gibbs of Fairfax County, Virginia and Margaret N. Harrison of Fairfax County, Virginia were by me united in the bonds of marriage at Residence of bride's parents on the 27th day of May in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and eighty six, conformably to the ordinance of God and the laws of the state. Minister of the Gospel: James M. Nourse. Witnesses at the marriage: Albert W. Harrison, Angeline C. Harrison. *
