Restoration News

The Park Authority will be advertising the Historic Huntley Restoration Project later this fall. This is very exciting! After the receipt of bids, a contractor will be chosen. In early spring the contractor will begin the restoration of the house and dependencies as well as working on site development, including parking lot and paths. Completion of the project is still projected to be in 2011. ❖

Grants

Virginia Department of Humanities grant money was used for landscape restoration in June. Davey Tree removed a number of trees, restoring the viewshed as recommended in the Cultural Landscape Report. Undesirable invasive tree species were removed as well.

Great news! Congressman Moran secured \$100,000 for restoration through the National Park Service's Save America's Treasures grant program. We're still working out the details, and amounts may be shifted as we go, but at present we're looking at dividing the grant money between a contracted historical architect/conservator, part-time staff archeologist, and exterior restoration on the main building. The contracted positions would help to ensure that any unforeseen problems that occur during excavation and restoration are dealt with properly.
